A pre-submission meeting is mandatory for BSAs that propose Active Restoration Management Actions (ARMA) or grazing.

Mandatory BSSAR and management plan templates

There are mandatory Biodiversity Stewardship Site Assessment Report (BSSAR) and management plan templates which should be used when completing and submitting a biodiversity stewardship agreement application.

Applications will be processed more efficiently when the templates are used and completed correctly. Failure to use the templates or provide sufficient information may result in otherwise avoidable delays.

The mandatory BSSAR and management plan templates can be accessed via the <u>'Apply for a</u> biodiversity stewardship agreement' webpage.

5. Publication of information on a public register

Approved BSAs are published on the public register of private land conservation agreements.

What information is published?

The BSA information made available on the public register includes:

- the BSA identification number and the date it was executed
- the local government area and the Interim Biogeographic Regionalisation of Australia (IBRA) subregion in which your agreement is located
- the number and class of biodiversity credits created in relation to the agreement
- the area of the agreement (in hectares).

Privacy notice

- a. Where the Landholder is an individual, in making this application, you are authorising the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water to use personal information (including name, address, email and phone number) to the extent necessary to process the BSA application, prepare a BSA and generate biodiversity credits and administer the BC Act. Except as required under legislation, only de-identified data will be released publicly.
- b. The *Government Information (Public Access) Act 2009* (NSW) may require the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water to publicly disclose information about the BSA.
- c. The Landholder acknowledges and consents to the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water collecting data and using data in connection with this Agreement for purposes reasonably required by the department.
- d. For more information on privacy, please see the <u>Department Climate Change, Energy, the</u> <u>Environment and Water privacy policy</u>.

Definitions and terms

ⁱ 'Owner' of the land is defined in section 1.6 of the *Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016* which, as at the date of preparation of this form, is as follows:

Owner of land includes:

- a. every person who either at law or in equity:
 - i. is entitled to the land for any estate of freehold in possession
 - ii. is a person to whom the Crown has lawfully contracted to sell the land under the *Crown Lands Act 1989* or any other Act relating to the alienation of lands of the Crown
 - iii. is entitled to receive, or is in receipt of, or if the land were let to a tenant would be entitled to receive, the rents and profits in respect of the land, whether as beneficial owner, trustee, mortgagee in possession or otherwise
- b. a person who leases land under the Crown Lands Act 1989, the Crown Lands (Continued Tenures) Act 1989 or the Western Lands Act 1901
- c. any other person who, under the regulations, is taken to be the owner of the land, but (unless the regulations otherwise provide) does not include a beneficiary of a trust relating to the land.

ⁱⁱ A landholder entering a biodiversity stewardship agreement and undertaking associated management actions is considered to be undertaking an enterprise. Therefore, any landholder wishing to apply for a biodiversity stewardship agreement must provide the NSW Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (the Department) with an Australian Business Number (ABN) registered for Goods and Services Tax (GST).

The Department will verify that the person or entity that holds the ABN is appropriately linked to the landholder. The Biodiversity Conservation Trust's Taxation Issues Landholder Guide provides some further information. The Department encourages landholders to obtain independent advice on taxation that considers their specific circumstances before (and ongoing after) entering a biodiversity stewardship agreement.

ⁱⁱⁱ Primary landholder is the owner, or one of the owners of the land to which the application for a biodiversity stewardship agreement relates that is designated by all landholders as the main contact for the purposes of this application.

^{iv} See section 5.8(5) of the Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016 and clause 5.3 of the Biodiversity Conservation Regulation 2017.

^v Associated Manager is defined in clause 5.3(3) of the *Biodiversity Conservation Regulation 2017* and at the time of the preparation of this form means:

- a. if the person is a body corporate a person who is, or has been within the previous 5 years, a director or concerned in the management of the body corporate
- b. if the person is in partnership with another person in connection with carrying out management actions on the proposed biodiversity stewardship site that other person.

^{vi} To 'contravene' includes fail to comply with (s 21(1) *Interpretation Act 1987*).
