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General scheme updates

Response to the Biodiversity Conservation Act review

On 17 July 2024, the NSW Government published the <u>NSW Plan for Nature</u> – the Government response to the statutory reviews of the *Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016* and native vegetation provisions of the *Local Land Services Act 2013*. It sets out proposed reforms to the Biodiversity Offsets Scheme. Biodiversity stewardship agreements update

As of 30 June 2024, **55 new BSAs were approved** during over the last 12 months. Since July 2022, a total of 96 new BSAs have been approved, covering **44,354 hectares**, and creating a total of 475,302 biodiversity credits. This represents a significant increase in the restoration of ecosystems and threatened species habitats.

Accredited assessor framework

The Nature Markets and Offsets (NMO) division will be making improvements and updates to the accredited assessor scheme framework. This will ensure:

- accredited assessors are applying the BAM correctly and consistently
- there is a high standard of integrity in the scheme and the code of conduct is being applied
- training, requirements and guidelines for accredited assessors reflect current practices and emerging issues.

NMO has also begun consultation with accredited assessors and other interested stakeholders on the requirements set out in the code of conduct.

Update to the Total Fund Deposit Calculator

An updated version of the TFD calculator is available on the <u>website</u> and for <u>download</u>. This is now the current version of the calculator and should be used in preparing any new applications for a Biodiversity Stewardship Agreement.

Consultation on list of entities at risk of serious and irreversible impacts

Consultation on proposed changes to the list of entities at risk of serious and irreversible impact is currently underway. The proposed changes are available on the <u>Serious and irreversible impacts</u> webpage. Feedback will be accepted until **Friday 16 August 2024.** To submit feedback, please use the form on the website:

- threatened species (and endangered populations) at risk of serious and irreversible impacts nomination form
- threatened ecological communities at risk of serious and irreversible impacts nomination form.

Select 'Provide feedback on a species/TEC currently being publicly displayed' when submitting your feedback. Changes to the list will be communicated to individual nominees and those who provide feedback, as well as via the BOS Updates newsletter.

Credits Supply Fund Reverse Auction 6 closed

The sixth Reverse Auction for the Biodiversity Credits Supply Fund closed for bids on Wednesday 10 July 2024. We are now progressing 111 bids to evaluation. Results from the reverse auction will be announced on Wednesday 21 August 2024 with transactions will progress shortly after. More information can be found on the Supply Fund webpage.

BCT Credit Tender 24-01 | Offers have commenced

The BCT has commenced making offers to purchase credits from successful bids in Credit Tender 24-01. As indicated in the <u>participants guide</u>, you will be provided **4 business days to respond**. This timeframe is required to enable the BCT to make offers to other applicants in a timely manner if you choose not to accept the BCT's offer. Please note that offers are made in rounds in ranked, prioritised order.

We expect to have completed most offers by 16 August. We will send notifications for unsuccessful bids. If you have any other questions about the Tender, please email us at the BCT Offsets Program Mailbox.

For accredited assessors

October BAM-C scheduled data update

The next regular update to BioNet data and the BAM Calculator (BAM–C) is scheduled to occur in early October 2024, which means the system will be unavailable. Further, BAM–C cases that are in progress or reopened following the update are likely to be impacted.

This is likely to include updates to the threatened entity information:

- PCT associations
- Records and distribution (including changes to known or predicted associated IBRA subregions)
- 'Ecological data' tab fields in the TBDC (for example, Habitat Constraints, Survey Comments) and
- Risk weighting and 'Serious and Irreversible Impacts' tab fields in the TBDC.

The department will provide further information about the updates closer to the date. To minimise disruption to BAM–C cases, we recommend that assessors finalise cases in advance of this time.

Other support

Important reminder about credit transfers and retirements

Applicants for credit transfers and retirements should note:

- It is a proponent's responsibility to ensure that biodiversity credits being transferred or retired will meet their offset requirements.
- The standard timeframe for processing an application to transfer or retire credits is 3 weeks. The application must be complete, with supporting proof of identity and legal authority, as required by the department's <u>Authority to sign and proof of</u> identity practice guideline.
- If you have critical deadlines, please outline the reasons for the urgency, including the date of the deadline at the time of submission. Applicants must account for the time required to pay the Total Fund Deposit and application fee.
- Further information on how to transfer or retire <u>BOS biodiversity credits</u> or BioBanking credits can be found on the department's website.
