Recent closure of the Walgett kangaroo processing plant, and other processors announcing limits and closures of chiller premises. Due to a combination of factors – competition from other proteins – drop in the price of beef and lamb, limited freezer space, increased fuel costs, challenging economic conditions overseas and animal rights activism. Macro focusing on high end domestic market. Cost increases – wages and super and fuel and energy costs – electricity contract price going up by 300% from 1st Jan 2024. Signal a drop in price for kangaroo, currently \$1.00/kg plus commissions, down from \$1.60. Drop from 90 buying sites to 35. Jurisdictions should provide a more cohesive position on the rigour and benefits of commercial harvesting. Taiwan opened for export in the past month – can now export kangaroo to Taiwan. Tier 2 operators only (those processors accredited as an audited abattoir permitted to export to unrestricted international countries). Processors seeing a reduction in female harvesting. Kangaroo numbers have been building out west, now appear to be flattening as conditions dry out. Less shooters on properties. Р	 IMP Team Leader's report – Terry resentation by Terry: 023 program review - another busy year for KMP 536 licensed harvesters. 24 licensed animal dealers. 115 registered premises. Despite the apparent downturn in the industry demand for tags has been strong, with 551,000 tags issued and 438,000 (24% of quota) animals harvested to-date. 2023 tag allocation higher than last year, and 2023 harvest on track to be higher than the previous 3 years. •	Western Aboriginal groups have a strong interest in accessing kangaroos for a range of reasons — cultural/food/ceremonial/funerals. Supportive of commercial program if done humanely. Strongly against mistreatment of kangaroos but also strongly against wasting the animal if it is killed. Current review of the BC Act providing an opportunity to amend the current clauses concerning indigenous access to protected species. The current wording is limited to 'personal use' and may not accommodate a broader family or community use/purpose.
