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## General updates

#### Biodiversity stewardship agreements update

As of 24 September 2024, **13 new biodiversity stewardship agreements were approved** since the start of the 2024–25 financial year. Since July 2022, a total of **109 biodiversity stewardship agreements** have been approved, covering **53,305 hectares**, and creating a total of **541,525** biodiversity credits. This represents a significant increase in the restoration of ecosystems and threatened species habitats.

#### **Biodiversity Values Map update**

The <u>Biodiversity Values Map V17</u> was published on 13 September 2024. Updates are based on new and improved mapping of biodiversity values, removal of developed land and other internal and external map review changes.

Detailed information about V17 updates is available on the <u>BV Map updates webpage</u> and updated spatial data is available through the <u>SEED Portal</u>. Landholders or agents, who need more information or consider the mapping is incorrect on their property, can apply for an <u>Explanatory Report or Map Review</u>.

#### Swift parrot important habitat map annual update

The annual update to the swift parrot important habitat map has been completed and was published in the Biodiversity Offsets and Agreement Management System map viewer and V17 of the Biodiversity Values Map on 13 September 2024. # Reminder: Sharing of passwords is prohibited under NSW Government security standards

Under the NSW Government Cyber Security Policy, the sharing of passwords to any NSW Government systems with a public interface is prohibited. This includes the Biodiversity Offsets and Agreements Management Systems (BOAMS) and Biodiversity Assessors and Accreditation System (BAAS). From mid-October 2024, multi-factor authenticator (MFA) will be applied to BOAMS and BAAS accounts. MFA is a mandatory requirement under the NSW Cyber Security Policy.

## For credit owners and buyers

### Sell biodiversity credits – Credit Tender 24-02 is open

The BCT <u>Credit Tender 24-02</u> is open for bids now until 9 October 2024. Applicants can offer the Biodiversity Conservation Trust a selling price for their biodiversity credits. This opportunity is available for hundreds of credit types across the state.

To submit a bid to sell biodiversity credits to the Biodiversity Conservation Trust:

- 1. Confirm the credits are on the Wanted Credits List (via the Credit Offer Portal)
- Submit a bid application offering a price to sell the credits to the Biodiversity Conservation Trust using the <u>Credit Offer Portal</u> by 11:59 pm Wednesday 9 October 2024.

In past tenders, the Biodiversity Conservation Trust has received a large proportion of ineligible bids as:

- 1. Credits offered for sale did not match credits owned
- 2. Supporting documents were inadequate or were not submitted with the application.

#### Upcoming opportunity to buy biodiversity credits

The Biodiversity Credits Supply Fund will open its seventh reverse auction from **Wednesday 9 October – Wednesday 23 October 2024**. The Supply Fund is currently working with potential buyers to identify target credits for the auction. If you would like to purchase credits through the auction, please contact the Credits Supply Branch via <u>supplyfund@environment.nsw.gov.au</u>. If you are a credit owner, or are in the process of establishing a biodiversity stewardship agreement, and would like to sell credits through the auction, keep an eye on the <u>Supply Fund reverse auction webpage</u> for more information.

### New sites progress through Stewardship Support Program

The Stewardship Support Program received 97 applications when it opened earlier this year. Evaluation is now complete, with 14 sites progressing to initial field assessment. This includes more than 6,000 hectares across 9 IBRA subregions, with many sites offering connectivity benefits and good potential for species credit generation. Providing this information is voluntary and will assist us to improve processing times. There is often high demand for these credit transactions at the end of each calendar year, so please submit your applications as soon as possible. # Streamlined assessment module – Planted native vegetation operational manual update

#### Guidelines on bilateral assessments

Updated guidance on impacts to matters of national environmental significance (MNES) is available on the NSW Planning Portal website on the Major Projects key guidance page.

The guidelines provide information for applicants and assessors on the preparation of a Biodiversity Assessment Report for a major project where there are predicted to be impacts on MNES under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act* 1999 (EPBC Act).

### Biodiversity Assessment Method Calculator system update

The annual system updates for the BAM-C are scheduled for late October 2024.

Updates include refinement of the user interface, including error messaging and notifications; various error and bug fixes; changes to support partial loss assessment for species credit species; and changes to threatened biodiversity data, including:

- to Plant Community Type associations to a small number of Threatened Ecological Communities and species (< 5)
- to IBRA subregion associations and geographic limitations to a small number of species (< 5)
- based on NSW Threatened Species Scientific Committee final determinations (new listings or changes to listing status)
- to entities at risk of serious and irreversible impact (SAII)
- to ecological data tab information including new data for recent BC Act and EPBC Act listed species and changes to survey months, survey comments, general notes, and habitat constraints fields (<15).
